



WHEREAS, George married Ann E. McGurn and became the father of two children, he was a devoted father and husband,

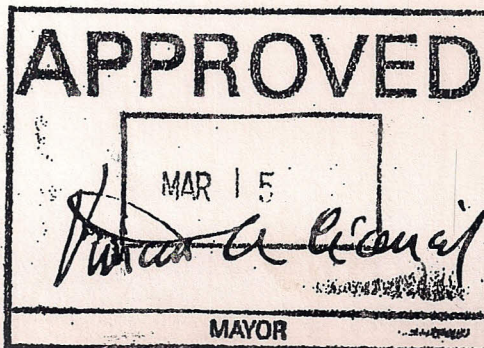

WHEREAS, A statue of Mr. Cohan has stood in the center of Times Square in New York City since 1959 in recognition of his musical and theatrical contributions; and

WHEREAS, He maintained strong ties to Providence throughout his life, always considering it his home; and

WHEREAS, There is a public effort being made by current Fox Point residents to erect a monument honoring Mr. Cohan at the corner of Governor and Wickenden Streets; and


WHEREAS, By honoring Providence's great artists and performers, the City helps to inspire future artists and bolster the entire arts community.


BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, That the Providence City Council supports the public effort to erect a sculpture honoring George M. Cohan on that site.

Whereas, Private Joseph Raymond Meenan, a native of Providence and the son of the late Nana Feeley Meenan and Thomas Meenan, a United States Army inductee paid the supreme sacrifice in the European Theatre of Operations, and

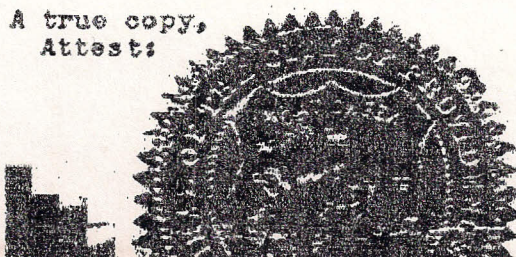
WHEREAS, the body of Private Meenan, a graduate of Saint Edwards Parochial School and LaSalle Academy who distinguished himself in C. Y. O. activities and as a member of the Saint Edwards Championship Baseball Team, is now interred in the United States Military Cemetery in Nettum, Italy, and

WHEREAS, to perpetuate his memory, many of his friends requested a proper memorial be designated to this recipient of the Purple Heart, posthumously;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the intersection of Veazie street and Woodward Road be and the same is hereby designated as "Private Joseph Raymond Meenan Memorial Square", as follows:

Beginning at the southwesterly corner of Veazie Street and Woodward Road, thence northeasterly and crossing Woodward Road, at right angles, thereto, to the northeasterly line of Woodward Road, thence southeasterly along the northeasterly line of Woodward Road to a point square opposite the southeasterly corner of Veazie Street and Woodward Road, thence southwesterly and crossing Woodward Road, at right angles thereto, to the southeasterly corner of Veazie Street and Woodward Road, thence northwesterly and crossing Veazie street to the southwesterly corner of Veazie Street and Woodward Road and the point and place of beginning; provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall be construed to change the designation of Woodward Road which is hereby declared to continue in and through said designated area.

WHEREAS, A resolution dedicating The William P. Armstrong Memorial Square was approved by the Providence City Council on May 20, 1946; and

WHEREAS, The William P. Armstrong Memorial Square was established at the intersection of Coddington and Cranston Streets; and

WHEREAS, During the period of 1960-1965, Coddington Street was eliminated in order to build a housing development; and

WHEREAS, The William P. Armstrong Memorial was removed and was never relocated; and

WHEREAS, On November 21, 2009, Flight Officer Armstrong was inducted into the Rhode Island Aviation Hall of Fame; and

WHEREAS, As stated in the 1946 Council resolution, "This veteran of the Italian campaign, a product of our local schools, was a graduate of Tuskegee Flying School"; and

WHEREAS, The Rhode Island Aviation Hall of Fame is honoring all Rhode Islanders who were members of the Tuskegee unit, the World War II African-American aviator's unit; and

WHEREAS, The 1946 Council resolution also states that Armstrong, "holder of the Distinguished Flying Cross, was the only Providence resident of our all-colored Air Squadron"; and

WHEREAS, Flight Officer William P. Armstrong was shot down and killed in Austria on April 1, 1945 while serving as a fighter-pilot with the 32<sup>nd</sup> Air Squadron of the 12<sup>th</sup> Air Force; and

WHEREAS, As the City Council in 1946 deemed "his heroic sacrifice worth of some lasting memorial," so does the City Council today recognize Flight Officer Armstrong's courageous service to his country.
